Ethiopian Premier League probes ten matches amid match-fixing allegations

The Ethiopian Premier League Share Company has launched an investigation into potential match-fixing involving ten games amid tensions between top teams and relegation battles as the season nears its end. To combat manipulation, the league's technical committee will probe the final rounds and hopes new TV coverage by SuperSport will help deter corruption, warning that any club involved will face legal consequences.

In Nigeria, the Nationwide League One (NLO) has launched an investigation into allegations that the chairman of Cynosure FC attempted to fix a match by contacting the chairman of Liberty Lions FC to influence the outcome in Cynosure's favor. Despite the lobbying efforts, Liberty Lions FC refused to participate, and the NLO has vowed to ensure that anyone found guilty will face punishment.

In Turkey, prosecutors arrested 13 suspects, including Papara founder Ahmed Faruk Karsl, for involvement in illegal gambling and money laundering operations that used Papara accounts to transfer illicit funds totaling TL12.9 billion, with authorities seizing assets worth TL5 billion.

FIFA reforms criticised 10 years on from corruption raid in statement from academics and human rights groups

A decade after the arrest of seven senior FIFA officials on corruption charges, an open letter from global football figures argues that FIFA is now "arguably more poorly governed" than before, citing ongoing governance flaws, lack of transparency, and controversial decisions like awarding the 2034 World Cup to Saudi Arabia. Despite FIFA's claims of reforms and increased investment in football development, critics say the organization's culture remains unchanged, hindering true ethical progress and effective internal reform.

United Kingdom

Revealed: English women's cricket becomes match-fixing target

English women's cricket is facing increasing corruption risks, with large sums bet on matches, players being approached for inside information, and minimal security at venues prompting a crackdown including anti-corruption officers and stricter measures like phone confiscations. Although no matches are confirmed fixed, concerns over unusual match patterns and widespread betting, especially at lower-tier games, have led to intensified efforts by the ECB to protect the integrity of the women's game as it grows more professional.
