TEXT OF RESOLUTION

HAVING NOTED the explanations given by the United Nations Observer and the Secretary General of the Organization on the setting up of the United Nations Fund for Drug Abuse Control, and on the proposed use to which this Fund is to be put;

The ICPO-INTERPOL General Assembly, meeting in Ottawa from 6th to 11th September 1971 at its 40th session:

- 1) IS PLEASED that the ICPO-INTERPOL is associated with a number of projects envisaged by the United Nations and APPROVES the positions adopted by the Secretary General with regard to these various projects;
- 2) CONSIDERS that it is of the utmost importance to make full use of the services of the ICPO-INTERPOL and of its General Secretariat for setting up training programmes for officers of law enforcement agencies;
- 3) REQUESTS the Organization's General Secretariat to make every effort to collaborate closely with the U.N. and ASKS the National Central Bureaus to help the General Secretariat effect this collaboration;
- 4) DECIDES to set up a Committee of three (1) to assist the General Secretariat in the preparation of brochures which could be used by law enforcement agencies.
