Remarks by INTERPOL Secretary General Jürgen Stock (video transcript)

Monsieur le Président de la République française Señor Presidente del Gobierno de España, Your Excellencies, Leaders of the OECD member countries, OECD Secretary General, Mr Ángel Gurria,

This is why as we mark the 60th anniversary of the OECD – I am pleased to announce that Secretary General Gurria and I will sign a joint Letter of Intent, paving the way for a stronger strategic partnership between the OECD and INTERPOL.
