The Toolkit for Responsible Artificial Intelligence Innovation in Law Enforcement is a practical guide for law enforcement agencies on developing and deploying Al responsibly, respecting human rights and ethics principles.

It is being jointly developed by UNICRI's Centre for AI and Robotics and INTERPOL's Innovation Centre, with the financial support of the European Union

Why do we need it

 Al is being increasingly adopted in law enforcement due to the unique opportunities it presents to support police work.

If AI is not integrated responsibly, however, individuals and societies may suffer from negative impacts.

There is a lack of guidance on responsible Al innovation tailored for the specific context and challenges of law enforcement.

The Toolkit bridges this gap and empowers law enforcement agencies to leverage Al while mitigating its risks.

The Toolkit V1.0 will be released in *June* 2023



What comes next

The Toolkit's roll-out will be complemented with capacity-building, training and certification for law enforcement agencies, as well as tailored support in the drafting of national law enforcement Al quidelines or strategies.
