

**The 1<sup>st</sup> INTERPOL Information Security Conference**  
**Welcome Address**  
**by the Hong Kong Commissioner of Police, Mr. TANG King-shing**

Secretary General, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen, good morning and welcome to Hong Kong.

Some technologies that used to appear only in movies have become reality. The technology is here. The applications are here.

Technology is like the moon. It has a bright side. It has a dark side. It certainly brings about convenience; but it also creates new risks.

According to Computer Security Institute's 2009 Computer Crime and Security Survey, the average loss incurred through a security incident was around two hundred and thirty thousand US dollars. The same amount of money can be used to plant more than 500 trees to help protect our environment.

On behalf of the Hong Kong Police Force, I would like to welcome you again to the 1<sup>st</sup> INTERPOL Information Security Conference. We are extremely honoured to co-host this conference together with the INTERPOL.

To start with, I would like to quote a well-known Chinese proverb, "When people are of one mind and heart, they can move Mount Tai." Mount Tai, or Taishan, is a sacred mountain in northern China near Confucius's home. Why would I quote this old saying?

The theme of this conference is "Global Co-operation Today for InfoSec Risks Tomorrow".
