## **RESOLUTION**

**Subject:** Recommendation adopted, by the 5th International Conference on Fraudulent Travel Documents, held in Amsterdam from 10th-12th April, concerning Interpol co-ordination with United Nations committees or working groups

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Yaoundé from 21-24 October 2002 at its 71st session:

HAVING TAKEN NOTE of the adoption, after discussion, of a Recommendation by the Fifth International Conference on Fraudulent Travel Documents, at which experts from 83 member countries were present (submitted as Recommendation Nine in Appendix to Report AGN-2002-RAP-10),

HAVING EXAMINED Report AGN-2002-RAP-10 submitted by the General Secretariat,

NOTING THE FACT that the United Nations has established a Committee, and promulgated a Convention, concerned with transnational organized crime, much of which is facilitated by fraudulent travel documents,

RECOMMENDS that the Interpol General Secretariat establish a reciprocal relationship with appropriate United Nations committees or working groups in order to co-ordinate policy initiative in areas of mutual interest.
