TEXT OF RESOLUTION

Having studied Report No. 5 on the international symposia held in 1965 and, in particular, the account of the Symposium for Heads of Police Training Colleges;

The ICPO-INTERPOL General Assembly, meeting in Berne from 31st August to 7th September 1966 at its 35th session:

RECOMMENDS that the Organization's members:

- 1) Ask the appropriate authorities in their countries to ensure that anyone beginning a career as a police officer, at whatever rank, receives thorough professional training of the type he needs in order to be able to perform his duties properly;
- 2) Arrange for information about the ICPO-INTERPOL (its purpose, organisation, activities, etc.) to be given as part of police training programmes so that police officers of all ranks are kept informed of the machinery for international police co-operation provided by the Organization.
