TEXT OF RESOLUTION

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly meeting in Caracas from 30th September to 7th October 1964, at its 33rd session:

1) HAVING CONSIDERED the resolutions adopted during the previous sessions of the General Assembly with respect to illicit traffic in drugs,

RECOMMENDS that all member countries intensify their programmes of prevention and repression and implement the said resolutions which have proven useful;

SPECIALLY INVITES member countries to use all available means to detect and destroy all clandestine laboratories as well as the illicit cultivation and production of the opium poppy, of the coca leaf and of cannabis;

2) NOTING THE FACT that certain chemical products are indispensable for the illicit production of heroin and cocaine,

URGES member countries where the presence of clandestine laboratories is known or suspected to take or reinforce the measures of control on these products;

3) CONSIDERING that morphine (i.e. the "999" brand) continues to represent a serious problem,

IS OF THE OPINION that the countries concerned must give it top priority;

4) CONSIDERING the fact that the efficiency of suppression directly depends upon the severity of the penalties inflicted on traffickers,

RECOMMENDS that member countries adopt appropriate legislative and administrative measures.
