- **100,000:** The estimated number of tigers in the wild in 1900s

- **3,200:** The estimated number of tigers remaining in the wild in 2011  
(Source: Global Tiger Recovery Program)
- **0:** The number of tigers expected in the wild in the year 2022 if tigers remain unprotected.  
(World Wildlife Fund)
- **3 years:** Maximum sentence in Indonesia for poaching tigers

- **\$50,000:** Market price for a wild tiger.

- **\$1,079:** Annual gross national income per person in South Asia.

- **13:** Countries that constitute the tiger range (Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, Russia, Thailand, and Vietnam.)
- **5:** Number of prime ministers that attended the Tiger Summit in St. Petersburg, Russia in November 2010
- **\$360,000,000:** Estimated cost of the Global Tiger Recovery Program approved at the Tiger Summit
- **\$860,000:** Current amount of funding for Project Predator
- **9:** Number of original subspecies of tigers
