Australia

Former Chelsea midfielder pleads guilty to 'yellow-card fixing scam' wortth '£100,000'

Former Chelsea signing and Macarthur FC captain Ulises Dávila has pleaded guilty to orchestrating a yellow-card match-fixing scheme in Australia's A-League, paying teammates to deliberately receive bookings across six matches between 2023 and 2024. The scandal, described as one of the biggest in Australian football history, has led to his contract termination, shaken public trust in the league's integrity, and prompted Football Australia to strengthen its anti-corruption measures ahead of Dávila's December sentencing.

Ireland

MMA: McGregor suspendu 18 mois pour infraction aux règles antidopage, mais disponible pour le combat à la Maison-Blanche Ireland's Conor McGregor, who hasn't fought since July 2021, has been suspended by the UFC for 18 months due to three "whereabouts failures" in 2024, though he never tested positive for doping. His suspension runs from September 20, 2024, to March 20, 2026, making him eligible to return in time for a planned UFC event at the White House on Donald Trump's birthday, provided he passes future drug tests and regains his form.

Sweden

Five Swedish players handed bans for cheating, matchfixing in multiple leagues across Europe

In Sweden, five Svenska Elitserien players have been banned for using cheats and engaging in match-fixing across multiple online leagues, with two receiving lifetime bans and three suspended for one year. The investigation, supported by physical evidence and player confessions, has led to wider repercussions across Europe as anti-cheat organizations extend bans and expose further cases of corruption.

UEFA

UEFA Has Banned Two Clubs from Europe for FFP Rules Amid Juventus Breach

UEFA has banned two clubs from European competition for financial rule breaches, while Juventus confirmed they are under investigation for potential violations of the "Football Earning Rule" covering the 2022–2025 seasons. Despite currently meeting spending ratio requirements, Juventus could face financial penalties or player registration limits, echoing their 2023 ban and fine for previous financial misconduct.

Australia

New national task force to target match-fixing across major sporting events

Australia is creating a national task force led by Sport Integrity Australia to safeguard major sporting events from match-fixing through enhanced coordination between law enforcement, regulators, betting agencies, and sports bodies. Focused on prevention and education ahead of events like the 2026 AFC Women's Asian Cup and the 2032 Brisbane Olympics, the task force aims to strengthen intelligence-sharing and uphold Australia's zero-tolerance stance on sports corruption.

New program supports players accused of doping, match-fixing

The International Tennis Integrity Agency has launched a trial program offering players under doping or match-fixing investigation free legal aid, confidential counseling, and up to \$5,000 for testing potentially contaminated products or food. Aimed at reducing the financial and emotional toll of such cases, the initiative follows recent high-profile doping incidents involving top players like Jannik Sinner and Iga Swiatek.

In his new book The Chain, Wiggins also opens up about his past cocaine addiction, recovery through Narcotics Anonymous, and personal struggles—including childhood abuse and homelessness—while rebuilding his life and career.

Argentina

Fifteen charged in Argentina over alleged match-fixing and betting fraud

In Argentina, fifteen people connected to Atenas de Río Cuarto, including players, club officials, and a provincial sports agency employee, have been charged in Córdoba for allegedly manipulating a match for betting profits estimated at ARS5 million. The case, which began after suspicious betting activity during a 3–0 loss to Juventud Unida de San Luis, could set a legal precedent as one of Argentina's first formal judicial investigations into match-fixing tied to regulated betting platforms.

Banned Kiwi cricketer warns of toll of match-fixing
