## **RESOLUTION**

**Subject:** Common security rules for Interpol's Information System

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Yaoundé from 21 to 24 October 2002 at its 71st session:

MINDFUL OF the conclusions of Report AG-2002-RAP-08 and its addendum on the need to define security standards applicable to the whole of Interpol's information system,

ALSO MINDFUL OF the project to amend the rules on the processing of police information (see Report AG-2002-RAP-06) and the need to put in place a coherent system to ensure the physical and legal integrity of the information within the co-operation system implemented by Interpol,

REFERRING to the conclusions set out in Report AG-2002-RAP-21 on the need to implement agreements in which member countries commit themselves to respecting the security rules laid down,

CONSCIOUS, also, of the need to implement the initial measures as soon as possible since they are essential to the smooth implementation of the new telecommunications system, I-24/7,

APPROVES the general guidelines set out in Report AG-2002-RAP-08;

ASKS the General Secretariat to develop and finalize the common security rules (see draft in Report AG-2002-RAP-08), following the general guidelines indicated above;

ALSO ASKS the General Secretariat to put in place without delay the basic elements of the security policy described in Report AG-2002-RAP-08 and its addendum and INVITES member countries to do likewise;

ASKS the General Secretariat to submit a set of finalized draft rules at its 72nd session, to be held in 2003.
