## **RESOLUTION**

<u>Subject</u>: Co-operation with UN CIVPOL and rules governing access by an intergovernmental organization to the Interpol telecommunications network and databases

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Budapest from 24 to 27 September 2001 at its 70th session:

NOTING THE CONTENTS OF Report AG-2001-RAP-04 entitled "Co-operation with UN CIVPOL",

ALSO NOTING the opinion given by the *ad hoc* Committee which examined the Report in conformity with Article 56 of the General Regulations,

RECALLING discussions during its 69th session (Rhodes, 2000), when it was suggested that the exchange of police information with intergovernmental organizations should be discussed at the session in 2001 (see AGN/69/PV/6 - item 9.3),

CONSIDERING that, in the respect of basic principles covering the exchange and protection of police information, the new approach outlined in AG-2001-RAP-04 is conducive to effective co-operation between Interpol and those intergovernmental organizations with which an agreement to that effect has been concluded,

FURTHER CONSIDERING that access should only be granted to intergovernmental organizations whose objectives are compatible with the ICPO-Interpol's aims to prevent and punish ordinary law crimes,

ADOPTS the Rules governing access by an intergovernmental organization to the Interpol telecommunications network and databases as attached as an appendix to AG-2001-RAP-04;

ASKS the Secretary General to conclude special arrangements with the United Nations within the limits provided for in the above-mentioned Report;

ASKS the Secretary General to submit to it any proposed agreement aimed at granting an intergovernmental organization access to Interpol's telecommunications network and, where appropriate, direct access to its databases.
