TEXT OF RESOLUTION

HAVING STUDIED Report No. 14 entitled "Police Co-operation within Mercosur",

TAKING NOTE of the decision of the 14th American Regional Conference to establish a Mercosur Working Party,

AWARE of the need to co-ordinate co-operation in police and judicial matters between Mercosur countries in order to combat international crime in the region effectively,

CONSIDERING that the Mercosur member countries should, in the same way as other regions which are similarly affected, adopt as of now, the appropriate police and judicial measures to prepare for the impact of opening borders and of the free movements of goods and persons in the region,

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Beijing from 4th to 10th October 1995 at its 64th session:

URGES the National Central Bureaus of the Mercosur countries to approach their respective governments with a view to setting up a public security sub-group within the Mercosur organizational structure, with the task of examining the procedures and corresponding measures to be adopted to meet the new requirements resulting from the abolition of controls at common borders.
