TEXT OF RESOLUTION

RECALLING that the Organization's aim is to ensure and promote the widest possible mutual assistance between all criminal police authorities in the spirit of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,

EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE of work done by Interpol to protect basic human rights and, notably, the rights of the child,

MINDFUL of Resolution AGN/62/RES/11 on illegal adoption adopted by the Interpol General Assembly at its 62nd session (Aruba, 1993),

CONVINCED of the need to strengthen international co-operation to prevent the growth of certain forms of crime which violate basic human rights,

AWARE that if international co-operation against such forms of crime is to be strengthened, the various categories of police personnel must be given appropriate training on human rights,

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Rome from 28th September to 4th October 1994 at its 63rd session:

RECOMMENDS that Members of the Organization encourage the adoption of measures designed to ensure that training on human rights is provided in police colleges.
