TEXT OF RESOLUTION

RECALLING that the status of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia was discussed during the 61st General Assembly session held in Dakar from 4th to 10th November 1992,

BEARING IN MIND Resolution 47/1 which was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 22nd September 1992,

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting from 29th September to 5th October 1993 in Aruba at its 62nd session:

CONSIDERS that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) cannot continue automatically the membership of the former Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia in the International Criminal Police Organization - Interpol;

CONSEQUENTLY DECIDES that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) must apply for membership of the Organization in conformity with Article 4 of the Constitution if it wishes to be a Member of the Organization.
