TEXT OF RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING that children are the most vulnerable members of society and need special protection from crime,

CONSIDERING that the best interests of the child should always be the primary consideration,

BEARING IN MIND that a multidisciplinary approach is required to combat offences against children effectively at all levels,

RECALLING ICPO-Interpol General Assembly Resolution AGN/58/RES/15, on the improvement of international co-operation to combat offences against minors,

BEARING IN MIND the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989),

HAVING TAKEN NOTE of the Report No. 16 on offences against minors, submitted by the General Secretariat to the National Central Bureaus,

AGREEING WITH the conclusions of the 1st International Symposium on Offences against Children and Young Adults (Lyons 1992),

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Dakar from 4th to 10th November 1992 at its 61st session:

RECOMMENDS that the member countries review their legislation and practices relating to offences against children with a view to introducing, where necessary, the measures recommended in the conclusions referred to above;

DECIDES that a Standing Working Party should be created to follow up the conclusions and co-ordinate subsequent action by member countries.
