TEXT OF RESOLUTION

CONSIDERING that if international police co-operation through Interpol channels is to be effective, it must be appropriately supplemented by mutual assistance in criminal matters and, more particularly, by the extradition of international criminals,

CONSIDERING that, in some cases, extradition requests fail because there are no appropriate legal instruments,

RECALLING the need to make effective use of all facilities offered by such legal instruments,

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Punta del Este from 4th to 8th November 1991 at its 60th session:

RECOMMENDS that the National Central Bureaus:

- strive unceasingly to foster the preparation or, where appropriate, the approval, of multilateral conventions and bilateral treaties to facilitate the extradition of international criminals, as well as the adoption of relevant laws in this field;
- where necessary, draw the attention of their competent national authorities to the existence of international instruments intended to facilitate extradition, and do everything in their power to ensure that, when their countries are party to such instruments, both those instruments and the national extradition laws, are applied effectively.
