TEXT OF RESOLUTION

SHARING the international concern which resulted in the adoption in New York in 1989 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child,

RECALLING the provisions of Article No. 3 paragraph 5, sub-paragraphs (f) and (g), of the 1988 United Nations Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances which describe the "victimization or use of minors" or the use of "educational institutions or... other places at which school children and students resort" for the purpose of drug abuse, production, trafficking, etc., as "particularly serious" crimes,

CALLING Interpol member countries' attention to the terms of Article 33 of the above-mentioned Convention which stipulates that "States Parties shall take all appropriate measures, including legislative, administrative, social and educational measures, to protect children from the illicit use of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances as defined in the relevant international treaties, and to prevent the use of children in the illicit production and trafficking of such substances",

ACTING in application of Resolution AGN/58/RES/15 adopted unanimously in 1989,

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Punta del Este from 4th to 8th November 1991 at its 60th session:

RECOMMENDS that police forces in Interpol Member States approach their appropriate national authorities to make them aware of the possible deterrent effect of measures to increase the penalties that may be imposed on traffickers **who provide children with drugs or who use children in the production or illicit trade in such substances.**
