#### TEXT OF RESOLUTION

HAVING NOTED that the use of fraudulent documents is a real and existing concern and that a concerted effort must be made to apprehend and prosecute persons responsible for producing and using such fraudulent documents;

BEARING IN MIND that a travel document is defined as any document which can be used to cross a border, the need to increase the security of such documents (to protect against theft, counterfeiting, and forgery) in accordance with the minimum standards developed by the Working Group is evident;

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Bangkok from 17th to 23rd November 1988 at its 57th session:

ASKS the General Secretariat to:

1. Promote an international conference (on the model of counterfeit currency conferences) to provide all Member States an opportunity to participate in the development of minimum security measures and procedures for the manufacture and issue of genuine travel documents. Participants should include representatives from departments issuing genuine travel documents. Authorized manufacturers and suppliers involved in the production of genuine travel documents as well as ICAO and IATA should be invited, as observers;
2. Actively seek, given the magnitude of the problem, a country to host an international conference within the near future.
