France

ICC to investigate allegations of match-fixing in cricket in France

In France, allegations have emerged that France Cricket (FC) staged fake women's cricket games to demonstrate commitment and secure funding from the International Cricket Council (ICC). The former French women's international and board member exposed the phantom games, prompting an investigation by the ICC. The report suggests that clubs faced fines if they couldn't field women's teams, leading to potential falsification of matches and concerns about the integrity of the sport's development in France.

Belgium

Belgian tennis players suspended

Seven Belgian tennis players have been suspended by the International Tennis Integrity Agency (ITIA) for admitting to breaches of the Tennis Anti-Corruption Program (TACP). The sanctions are linked to a match-fixing syndicate in Belgium, resulting in custodial sentences for the syndicate's leader. Suspensions range from two years and seven months to four years and 10 months, with fines imposed, and the players are prohibited from participating in any ITIA-sanctioned events during their suspensions.
