TEXT OF RESOLUTION

HAVING CONSIDERED the reports sent by affiliated countries,

The ICPO-Interpol General Assembly, meeting in Madrid from 19th to 26th September 1962 at its 31st session:

CONSIDERS that having regard to the two uses to which colour photography can be put - i.e. to provide information for the police and to provide evidence in court - colour photography may be used. However, considering the present limitations of colour photography, it is recommended that it be used with caution.
